



## Safety Statement

The second Cork Cycling Arts Festival will take place from Monday 20th to Sunday 26th July 2009 with a range of free events celebrating bicycle culture in Cork including 3 cycle rides in the city centre. Being an Arts Festival there will be an exhibition in the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street (between Patrick Street and Oliver Plunkett Street) throughout the festival.

### Safety Policy Statement

It is the policy of Cork Cycling Arts Festival to do all that is reasonably practicable to ensure a safe and healthy festival. All reasonable measures will be taken to minimise risks to those directly involved in these activities and also to those who may be indirectly affected by these activities.

All members of the Festival Team and Volunteers are expected to comply with policies and procedures as described in the Safety Statement.

We have consulted Garda John O'Sullivan of Anglesea Street Garda Station about the 3 cycle rides.

During the week of the Festival there will be 3 cycle rides in the city:

### Cycle through the Planets

A cycle will leave the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street at 7pm on Wednesday the 22nd of July 2009 and proceed out along the docklands, Centre Park Road, the Marina and Castle Road stopping off briefly at various points, and end at the Blackrock Observatory at approximately 8pm.

### Cork Songs Cycle Tour

A cycle will leave from in front of Cork Opera House at 7pm on Thursday the 23rd of July 2009 and proceed to Patrick Street, Grand Parade, Cornmarket Street, Lavitt's Quay, Patrick's Bridge, Patrick's Hill stopping off briefly at various points, and ending at Youghal Old Road at Collins Barracks at approximately 8.30pm.

### Treasure Hunt

A group will leave the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street at 2pm on Saturday the 25th of July 2009 and proceed individually to collect a series of clues which will lead them to a final destination at a well known landmark in the city centre. The duration will be approximately 1 hour. This will not be a group cycle.

### We will have in place the following safety measures:

- The cyclists will stay together as one group as much as possible and will be guided by stewards.
- Stewards will cycle in front, at the rear and on the outside of the group.
- All cyclists will be provided with safe cycling information and will be encouraged to wear protective helmets.
- All cyclists will be asked to obey the rules of the road and to exercise caution for themselves and other road users including pedestrians at all times.
- The 3 rides are each planned for up to 50 people however we expect no more than 30 people on any one cycle ride.
- Stewards will be instructed to contact the emergency services in the event of any accidents.

Public Liability Insurance is in place for these events.
