



Safety Statement - Revision A. 21.07.10

The third Cork Cycling Arts Festival will take place from Monday 19th to Sunday 25th July 2010 with a range of free events celebrating bicycle culture in Cork including 4 cycle rides in the city centre. Being an Arts Festival there will be an exhibition in the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street (between Patrick Street and Oliver Plunkett Street) throughout the festival.

Safety Policy Statement

It is the policy of Cork Cycling Arts Festival to do all that is reasonably practicable to ensure a safe and healthy festival. All reasonable measures will be taken to minimise risks to those directly involved in these activities and also to those who may be indirectly affected by these activities.

All members of the Festival Team and Volunteers are expected to comply with policies and procedures as described in the Safety Statement.

We have consulted Sargeant John O'Sullivan of Anglesea Street Garda Station about the 4 cycle rides.

During the week of the Festival there will be 4 cycle rides in the city:

Street Furniture Cycle

A cycle will leave the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street at 7pm on Monday the 19th of July 2010 and proceed out along Oliver Plunkett Street, Grand Parade, Washington Street, Hanover Street, Western Road, Mardyke Walk, Ferry Walk, back onto Mardyke Walk, to Western Road, cross river at Thomas Davis Bridge, Sunday's Well Road, North Mall, cross river at North Gate Bridge onto Kyril's Quay, Lavitt's Quay, Cross river at Patrick's Bridge, Walk up Patrick's Hill to Wellington Road, and return to city by York Hill, Summerhill, cross river at Brian Boru Bridge, and proceed along Merchant's Quay, Patrick Street and back to Prince's Street. We will be stopping off briefly at various points, and end at approximately 9pm.

4 Cities Cycle

A cycle will leave from Unitarian Church at 7pm on Wednesday the 21st of July 2010, stopping off briefly at various points. Because of the road works in Patrick Street we will walk the bikes to Christy Ring Bridge. We will then proceed up John Redmond Street, onto Church Street, Shandon Street down to North Gate Bridge, walk up north main Street as far as site of Skiddy's Castle, then proceed along North Main Street, South Main Street, Proby's Quay, Bishop Street, Gillabbey Street, Connaught Avenue, back down Gillabbey Street, Dean Street, Fort Street, Barrack Street, Cove Street, walking over footbridge to Grand Parade as far as Oliver Plunkett Street and ending at Unitarian Church at approximately 9 pm.

Art Trail

A group of cyclists will leave the Unitarian Church in Prince's Street at 7pm on Friday the 23rd of July 2010 and proceed onto Oliver Plunkett Street, Grand Parade, walk over pedestrian bridge to Sullivan's Quay, Proby's Quay, Bishop Street, Gillabbey Street, College Road, enter UCC at top gate and exit at Main Gate at intersection of O'Donovan Road and Western Road then, Mardyke Walk to Fitzgerald Park, then along Lee Walk to North Mall, Shandon Street, Dominick Street, back out Church Street onto Shandon Street, Gerald Griffin Street, O'Connell Street, Watercourse Road, then doubling back along Gerald Griffin Street onto N20 Leitrim Street and ending at Civic Trust House on Pope's Quay. The duration will be approximately 2 hours.

Food Cycle

The Food Cycle will meet near the city centre and proceed by foot to visit various shops in the city centre and will then proceed by bike to Winthrop Street, the group will walk over to Opera Lane to Christy Ring Bridge and cycle to John Redmond Street to the Butter Market. Then to Church Street, onto Shandon Street, Gerald Griffin Street, O'Connell Street, Watercourse Road and walk over N20 Leitrim Street to Assumption Road and Pope's Road and end at the Cork Foyer (former Assumption Convent).

We will have in place the following safety measures:

- The cyclists will stay together as one group as much as possible and will be guided by stewards.
- Stewards will cycle in front, at the rear and on the outside of the group.
- All cyclists will be provided with safe cycling information and will be encouraged to wear protective helmets.
- All cyclists will be asked to obey the rules of the road and to exercise caution for themselves and other road users including pedestrians at all times.
- The 4 rides are each planned for up to 50 people however we expect no more than 30 people on any one cycle ride.
- Stewards will be instructed to contact the emergency services in the event of any accidents.

Public Liability Insurance is in place for these events.
